LAKESIDE CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP Leadership Council Report for March 14, 2022

CALL TO ORDER: The Leadership Council meeting was called to order at 2PM by Moderator, Fred Pontesso. Council member present were Fred Pontesso, June Freeman, Donna Nash, Genie Carroll, Bill Bush, Ginger Halsted, Rev. Chuck Smith, Rev. Rick Waters, Dave Farwell, Page Massey, Jack Tyler, and Judy Guthrie. A quorum was met.

INVOCATION: Rev. Rick Waters opened with a prayer.

OPENING REMARKS: Page Massey stated "What you think about, you bring about" COMMISSION REPORTS

FINANCIAL UPDATE: Current income is supporting the expenses although donations are down from previous year to date.

STEWARDSHIP COMMISSION: Dave Farwell and Page Massey reported that the first "Meet and Greet" gathering was held on Sunday, March 13th at 10AM in the Activity Center and was well attended. Page presented a sign-up sheet for volunteers to sponsor future pre-service gatherings by providing food. Coffee and water will be provided by the Stewardship committee. There were some volunteers although many more are needed. Page inquired about a possible budget to cover expenses for these gatherings but no decision was made by the council. Dave and Page had two easels made to direct people to our church on Sundays. One was placed at the corner of Highland Lake Drive and American Drive and one was placed on Boggy Ford Road and American Drive. Dave and Paige have volunteered to continue to place these signs in the designated areas on each Sunday. Dave presented several ideas he has for attracting new members and retaining existing members to Lakeside Christian Fellowship. Ideas included "Ripples Rewards", "Attendance recognition awards" and sponsoring local sports teams. He spoke again about the need to create an additional council po

tion as a "Communications Manager" who would be responsible for promoting our church in the Northshore Community. No motion was made at this time but a discussion was held about adding our address to all church communications, adding our name, address and website to the Lago Vista/Jonestown Chamber of Commerce newsletter, possibly adding an article to the Northshore Beacon, and making sure that our name pops up on the Facebook Community Board. June Freeman stated she would add this need for a communications person to the new Volunteer Flyer that will be given out at church services and included in the next Ripples.

BUILDING & GROUNDS: Bill Bush made a motion (1) that "The building and grounds committee can access the Project Operating Fund for any needed repairs and purchases not to exceed \$1000 without council prior approval. Any expense exceeding this amount will require approval from the Leadership Council". Motion was seconded by June Freeman. Motion carried.

FAITH IN ACTION: Chair Wilma Sanders is still away so no report or actions were taken by this committee.

WORSHIP COMMISSION: Ginger Halsted reported that the piano in the sanctuary belongs to the Hill Country Singers and they would like to sell it to the church. She also reported that music is being selected for the Easter service.

PASTORAL RELATIONS: Jack Tyler reported that this committee had not met but the Pastoral Search committee had recently met and sent out letters of interest for a new pastor to two seminaries in Austin. One negative response was received to date. Both Chuck and Rick stated that they have made other inquiries among their personal contacts for Rick's replacement.

MINISTRIES: June Freeman reported that an ADJOURN: Page Massey moved (2) to adjourn updated Volunteer sheet will be attached to the next Ripples with a request that completed sheets be either returned to the church office or brought to the Sunday service. She has also inquired about the cost of signs to be placed around town advertising our Easter Sunrise Service. She obtained a cost of \$4-\$5 each for "yard sized" stake sign. The Council decided that these should not be date specific so they could be re-used in future years and authorized the purchase of 12 signs to be placed in high traffic areas around town on or about the weekend of Palm Sunday. June's committee also decided we should have a Fellowship Potluck luncheon at the Bar K Park Grand Pavilion at the end of April on either Saturday or Sunday the 23rd or 24th. The council agreed this was a great idea and a food menu will be selected and provided to church members. Our "Fifth Sunday Potluck" in May will be replaced with a Farewell Reception for Rev. Rick Waters. Details to follow.

OUTREACH: Pastor Chuck reported that the Alzheimer's Support Group continues to meet but the Cancer Support Group has not yet been started. Attendance at the Coffee Klatch is great but the Men's Bible Study group has low attendance and perhaps a different time of day should be selected to attract more attendance.

OLD BUSINESS: None

NEW BUSINESS: It was discussed that the minutes would be sent to Fred Pontesso for review and approval or correction. Once minutes are finalized, they will be distributed by the council secretary with an email to all council members for their review before the final copy is sent to the office manager for inclusion in the Ripples.

FUTURE TOPICS: The next council meeting will be held on Monday April 11, 2022.


The primary function of ushers/greeters is to welcome the congregation and visitors as they arrive, as well as passing out bulletins.

Online Donations to Lakeside Christian Fellowship Church.

We have made it easier than ever to send your tithe and offerings to Lakeside without leaving the comfort of your home.


Your Leadership Council approved and sanctioned the use of online donations some time back. It took several months to search and find the best way to do that.

Thanks to Bill Bush we now have a donate button on our website: www.lakesidechristians.org to electronically provide a way to use a credit card or if you have a paypal account to donate. The process is simple and the church will pay the small service fee (unless you choose to add it to your donation).

The process is simple. Go to our website and look for the donate button on the home page, click on it and it will bring up the steps needed to make the donation. The page identifies Lakeside as the recipient and a place to select whether paying by credit card or your paypal account shou

place to select whether paying by credit card or your paypal account should you have one although a paypal account is not required to use the service.

We keep track of all records as we do and will send you a receipt for tax purposes at the end of the year. Also Bill has an article on the following page where you can have your donations subtracted from your gross income thereby reducing your income that is subject to taxes.



New Options For Contributing To Lakeside Christian Fellowship

In addition to taking advantage the convenience and security of LCF's new online donation capabilities (at lakesidechristians.org/donations), those interested in donating with tax efficiency may want to consider a **Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)** directly from their IRA.

What Is A Qualified Charitable Distribution?

In 2015, Congress permanently enacted the IRS QCD rule. For those older than 70.5, this rule allows traditional IRA owners to exclude their Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) from their adjusted gross income as long as they give the money to a qualified charitable organization such as Lakeside Christian Fellowship.

And The Contribution Is Considered Part Of My Required Minimum Distribution?

Yes. If you're older than 70.5 and the charitable organization is qualified, as is LCF, under the IRS QCD rule, your charitable contribution is included in your annual RMD.

How Is Making a QCD Different Than Simply Deducting The Charitable Donation?

By reducing your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) by the amount of your QCDs, you may minimize other factors that are based on AGI, such as Medicare premiums. Also, because the Standard Deduction is based on age and filing status (not AGI), if you take the Standard Deduction vs. itemizing, the Standard Deduction reduces AGI in arriving at Taxable Income. So starting with a lower AGI may in-turn reduce your Taxable Income. The following example shows 2 scenarios that demonstrate this idea:

How Do I Go About Making A Qualified Charitable Distribution?


The custodian of your IRA will provide a simple form which you can fill out to specify your IRA account, the donation amount, and the name of the qualified charity to which you wish to contribute. The forms are usually available online and require your physical signature.


