### DROUGHT: PRELUDE TO RENEWAL

"Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose trust is the Lord. That one is like a tree planted by water, that sends out its roots by the stream, and does not fear when heat comes, for its leaves remain green, and is not anxious in the year of drought, for it does not cease to bear fruit."

2 Chronicles 7:13-14

Drought is a time of the withering and decline of all forms of life that rely on water to survive, let alone grow and flourish. It is also a time of cleansing, a prelude to renewal.

Drought is not just a geophysical occurrence based on weather patterns and climate changes — it may also manifest as a condition of the soul, as a spiritual drought. The dryness of the soul emerges when we cannot receive or perceive the living waters of God's love that flow to us and through us — forgetting that the love of God never recedes or dries up, no matter what conditions afflict us. We may feel abandoned, isolated, even shattered by life circumstances. We may be completely withdrawn into ourselves, seeking the self-protection of avoiding any more pain or loss. But the truth is that you are still immersed in those living waters no matter what you feel or tell yourself.

Never doubt the replenishing love that God has for you when you are in a spiritual drought in your own life, or impacted by the spreading dryness that is blanketing the world. Even when our heart is dry for Him, His heart is never dry for us.

Lakeside Christian Fellowship has deep roots into the living water of God's love, even as drought takes its toll on the world around us. Our Fellowship is our spiritual oasis, sustaining us through hard knocks, painful losses and tough times...times of drought within and without. Remember, every drought ends. The patterns that steer the weather of life are constantly shifting and changing. Rain falls from heaven, as does grace, and the dryness softens to receive more. Dormant life stirs, revives, and peeks out – still uncertain that the drought is gone – slowly gaining the courage to fully emerge and vigorously grow.

We all know this by heart: 1. The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. 2. He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters. Psalm 23:1-2

Lakeside Christian Fellowship "is like a tree planted by water, that sends out its roots by the stream." There is no spiritual drought in this Fellowship planted by the Lake. Our "leaves remain green" as we transition into our next season of growth and fruition. The life in Christ we share is evergreen, nourished by the Holy Spirit within each of us. # LAKESIDE CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP Leadership Council Report for June 13, 2022

The leadership council meeting was called to order at 2:00PM by moderator Fred Pontesso. Council members present were Fred Pontesso, June Freeman, Judy Guthrie, Donna Nash, Wilma Sanders, Genie Carroll, Chuck Smith, Don Killough, Rodger Elliott, Jack Tyler, and Ginger Halsted. A quorum was present.

**Invocation:** Pastor Chuck Smith opened with a prayer.

**Opening Remarks:** "Thoughts to ponder"- Fred Pontesso stated "Being negative only makes a journey more difficult. You may be given a cactus but that doesn't mean you have to sit on it." -Joyce Meyer

**Approval of Minutes:** Minutes of the May 9<sup>th</sup> meeting were approved by acclimation.

### **Commission Reports:**

<u>Financial Update</u> – May donations increased over April and income is in line with expenses. The online donation option is still being "tweeked" so it works properly.

Stewardship Commission – Don Killough issued outlines to all council members for 2023 Budget Planning and the 2023 Stewardship Drive. All budget worksheets and 2023 budget requests from commission/ministry chairs are due to the church office by July 21<sup>st</sup>. A draft of the proposed budget for 2023 will then be presented to the Leadership council at the August meeting. The stewardship drive will begin on August 28<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Building and Grounds</u> – No update. The rental lease with corrections to various items is still in the hands of the owner for signature. Many thanks were given to Rodger Elliott for the large projector screen mounted in the activities center that was used for Rick Water's retirement reception and is now available for other uses by the church.

<u>Faith in Action</u> – Although Chair Wilma Sanders will be out of town in August when school begins, she will be in contact with the school district about their needs for supplies or other items for children without means and will present this information to the council for review and approval.

Worship Commission – Ginger Halsted stated that more ushers are still needed for the months of July and August and reminded the group that the choir would be out for the summer and would resume in September. She stated that church members had commented that no prior announcement had been made about our guest minister, Susan Galvan, for Sunday, June 12<sup>th</sup>.

Pastoral Relations – Jack Tyler recommended to the committee that we seek out an equipment operator/ technician to manage the equipment for recording the church service on Sundays and put up the link for the service on the internet. He estimated this would be about a two hour time commitment each Sunday. A discussion was held among council members who agreed this was a definite need so Jack will pursue finding a possible high school or college student in Lago Vista for the position.

Search committee – There are now two candidates interested in the position of "co-Pastor" to assist Chuck Smith with services on a part-time basis. One of these candidates will be visiting our church and giving the sermon and communion on Sunday July 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Ministries – June Freeman stated that there were 72 people in attendance for Rick Waters' retirement reception. Catering costs were estimated to serve 100 people. The costs totaled \$523 for food, flowers, cake and paper products. There was also a lot of food donated by church members. The reception was beautiful, and thanks were given to Chuck Smith for the wonderful video he presented following the life of Rick Waters through his years of service as a Pastor.



# LAKESIDE CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP Leadership Council Report for June 13, 2022

Meet and Greet – More people are needed to set up t this event on Sundays and provide a small amount of cookies or breakfast pastries. Attendance is increasing each week at this gathering. It was decided by the council that the doors into the Sanctuary be closed on Sunday morning so all attendees will enter through the office doors into the activities center thus leaving the Sanctuary available for silent prayer prior to the start of the service. A sign will be posted on the door entering the sanctuary through the rest room/choir room area reminding people to be quiet as they enter the sanctuary.

<u>The Gaither Vocal Band event</u> – Regina Holmes visited the Council to present the idea of a church trip to see this wonderful Gospel Music Group on October 15<sup>th</sup> at Life Austin Church. A bus would need to be reserved which would hold 40-50 people and 40 tickets would need to be pre-purchased for sale to church and community members at the cost of \$50 each which would cover the majority of the cost for the bus and the concert. She requested that the church advance these expenditures as the concert would sell out quickly. Ginger Halsted moved that the church advance the cost of reserving the bus and purchasing the 40 tickets at a cost not to exceed \$2500 with funds being taken from the surplus budget fund. June Freeman seconded the motion. A vote was held and the motion carried. (1)

Outreach – Chuck Smith stated that the Alzheimer's Support Group would be moving their meetings back to the Lago Vista Library on July 21<sup>st</sup>. This location is more centrally located for most attendees and will also then be posted on the library calendar which is printed on the insert with all water bills. Chuck stated that the previous Sunday service had 57 people in attendance and 26 viewing live on line for a total of 83 people. (not considering that more than 1 person might be viewing on line from one location). Thirty-seven more people viewed the service within the next 24 hours.

**Old business:** The previous large water bill that was received due to the toilet leak was being paid out over time. The new software that allows daily review of utility use will now be used to track electricity and water usage by the church.

**New business:** There will be no council meeting in July.

**Future topics:** The next council meeting will be held on August 8, 2022.






