Dear Church Family,

"Ask the Lord for rain in the springtime; it is the Lord who sends the thunderstorms. He gives showers of rain to all people, and plants of the field to everyone. (Zechariah 10:1 NIV)

I ran across an article on the Internet that says, "If you want to understand the ways of the Lord, plant asparagus." (https://www.gardenindelight.com)

Each year, spring begins on either March 19, 20, or 21 (This year 2023 March 20<sup>th</sup>). Then autumn begins six months later. The start to both these seasons is called an equinox, which means "equal night" in Latin. On both these days, daylight and nighttime occur for equal lengths of time. What's more, when the spring equinox occurs in the Northern Hemisphere, the autumn equinox occurs in the Southern Hemisphere (and vice versa).

Our two other seasons, summer and winter, begin with a solstice. On these days at noon, the sun is at its highest or lowest point in the sky. This marks the longest and shortest lengths of daylight each year respectively. These seasons, marked by the movement of the sun, moon, and stars, remind us that God placed them in the solar system for this purpose. They are not arbitrary events. Like a most reliable clock, he designed these seasons to occur for as long as the Earth remains. He is the one who created the seasons.

But back to the asparagus. "Early in spring, the asparagus bed is just a bed, a plain patch of dirt. But leave for a weeklong trip, and upon your return you may find the tender spears have shot up to over three feet tall! Where there had been nothing, now triumphant stalks stand proud and graceful, bursts of life from barren ground. Amazing! These are not precious little tips peeking through the soil, but stems strong and plentiful, a full plot reporting the week of warming weather." There is nothing new in this story, especially if you are a seasoned gardener, but it springs up two points: First, that we can hear spring stories like this – seeds sprouting, bare trees leafing out, flower buds swelling to bloom – but when we see them, when they are our personal experience and when we personally stand in awe at their appearance, that is another matter altogether. We know; we believe! Life has burst up from the sleeping soil before our very eyes and sends joy, resilience and wonder surging through our soul.

Secondly, that the garden stewards the story of spring, the resurrection story: What was dead comes back to life. The moment simply speaks to us of Jesus' resurrection, an event the returning array of asparagus imprints on us with a deeper intensity. The bare plot turned vegetable crop shows us new birth and a living hope, a graphic and delicious account of death to life.

Over and over the spring garden proclaims the way of God's salvation; new shoots and vibrant leaves keep us in the company of the redemption story, reminding us that God has blessed us with his salvation.

# LAKESIDE CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP Leadership Council Report for February 13, 2023

The Leadership Council meeting was called to order at 2:00PM by moderator, Fred Pontesso. Council members present were Fred Pontesso, Judy Guthrie, Donna Nash, Genie Carroll, Warwick Andrews, Pastor Chuck Smith, Bill Bush, Jack Tyler and June Freeman. A quorum was present.

**Invocation:** Pastor Chuck Smith opened with a prayer

Opening Remarks: "Thought to Ponder" – "The sole meaning of life is to serve humanity" – a quote from Leo Tolstoy was provided by Fred Pontesso.

**Approval of Minutes:** The minutes of the January 9, 2023 council meeting were approved by acclimation.

### **Commission Reports:**

Financial Update – Warwick Andrews reported that our income for 2022 totaled \$179,000 and the budgeted forecast was \$183000. Income for the month of January 2023 was about \$2000 less than expenses for the month. Warwick brought up looking into taking a portion of our assets currently held in the savings account and placing them in a 1yr. CD since interest earnings on these instruments are now in the 4% range. He will look into earning rates from the bank and the council will discuss this again at the next meeting. Warwick also had a meeting with Debbie Reed, office administrator, about the format and presentation of our income and expenses, balance sheet and comparisons of budgeted vs. actual expenses. Some revisions are being made in the reports so that they are easier to read and analyze. Debbie asked that we remind parishioners that before she can issue a check for any expense

es, she must receive a signed and approved "disbursement request form". These forms are available at the office. Warwick brought up the fact that some of our parishioners are not attending church in person due to physical limitations. Warwick made a motion (1) that we purchase 8 chairs with arms on them to help those with mobility limitations and set up a designated area for these in the sanctuary. Funds for this purchase would come from the designated Building Fund. Motion was seconded by Bill Bush. After a vote by council, motion carried.

<u>Stewardship</u> – Warwick Andrews had nothing new to report other than to state that donations are on track with commitments.

Building and Grounds – Bill Bush stated that the new computer is installed and in use by the office staff. The old computer is being reviewed by an IT professional for its functional capacity. New cleaning supplies have been purchased including a new mop! Bill provided an update on his research of the cost of replacing the front doors to the sanctuary. His second quote was more expensive that the first one but was more comprehensive. He will continue to research the replacement cost. Chuck Smith suggested that once we have the best bid, we ask the building owner to either pay for it or share in the cost of the new doors.

<u>Faith in Action</u> – Jan Robbins was unable to attend and had no report.

**Worship Commission** – Genie Carroll reported that all positions on her commission are filled and provided a reminder that the Gospel Sing Along will take place on February 25<sup>th</sup> at 3PM in the Fellowship Hall. Bill Bush provided the banner that will be placed along Lohman Ford Road for advertising of the event. Parishioners are reminded to invite their friends and

neighbors to the free event. Chuck Smith provided a preaching schedule for February through April. There will be an Ash Wednesday service at 6PM on February 22<sup>nd</sup>. There will be no church service on March 5th due to the Lago Vista Primavera Bike Race being held on March 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>. Chuck presented information on the special Good Friday Service to held be April "The seven last words of Christ". A discussion was held and a decision was made to purchase a large banner to advertise this service to the community and it will be held in the Fellowship Hall. He stated that we would again have an Easter Sunrise Service at Hancock Park and stated that is was very well attended last year. He suggested that we post more signs along Lohman Ford Road and in busy areas around town.

<u>Pastoral Relations</u> – Jack Tyler had no report but offered to remind parishioners at Sunday's service not to use church office supplies or equipment for personal reasons.

Ministries Commission - June Freeman reported that her team provided food and beverages and set up the Fellowship Hall for the memorial service for Beth Kiker. Her team will also provide set up and refreshments for the Gospel Sing Along on February 25<sup>th</sup>. Christian Woman's Fellowship will donate the funds to pay the musicians for this event. June and Chuck have also been discussing a "Lunch and Movie" event presenting the movie "The Shack". More to come on this event next month. Parishioners are encouraged to ask their friends and neighbors to attend this event once the date is set. Chuck Smith has also looked into the cost of having golf type T-shirts made with our church name and logo in them,

#### **New Business:**

Membership Audit Roll – The current membership roll has 92 members (91 members and 1 associate member). Letters were sent to members who had been inactive for over 1 year. There was no response from 9 members. Other members either could not be contacted or are inactive for other reasons and the total of all is 18. A motion was made by Warwick Andrews (2) to remove the 18 people from our membership rolls. Motion was seconded by June Freeman. After the council vote, motion carried. After this change our membership rolls will total 73 plus one associate member for a total of 74.








A new study on the book of Judges began on December 7, 2022. The bible study meets in the LCF Fellowship Hall at 9:30 a.m.








Remember that there is a receptacle at the back of the church for non-perishable food items which are always in need and will be donated to Hill Country Community Ministries.
