It is a fact that the last two years have been the hottest on record for the Austin area. Multiple days with temps exceeding 100 degrees are being common it seems. Our congregation is made up of the more mature Christians. Notice that I didn't say we're old, but as I look out over our congregation it is obvious that we all are "chronologically gifted."

Therefore our health is of vital concern given the recent temperatures we're experiencing. So what does the Bible say about our physical health? Plenty – more than enough to write about in a page or two, but I'll give it a shot.

The Bible says in 3 John 1:2, "I pray that you may enjoy good health and that all may go well with you, even as your soul is getting along well." While you may be incredibly spiritually strong, you need to glorify God through your physical health as well. The Bible teaches us how we should treat our bodies in a way that God intends.

Megan Bailey a writer for *Beliefnet* tells us that, "God gave us our human bodies on earth and He wants us to take care of them. That means providing it with food that is nourishing and getting ample exercise. Neglecting or abusing our bodies can be considered a sin."

The Bible is a great place to learn about how to take care of ourselves. However, like most anything, humans can become too obsessed with their physical health to the point that they begin to idolize it. The Bible says in 1 Timothy 4:8, "Physical training is of some value, but godliness has value for all things, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come". There is a way to balance the different aspects of your life in a way that glorifies the Lord. You should make time to be mentally healthy, physically healthy and spiritually healthy all at the same time. Do not let one consume the other, or else you are not putting Jesus Christ in the center of your life.

The Bible gave us instructions regarding physical health years before scientists developed the technology. God is all-knowing when it comes to our health, and therefore all of the discoveries we have in modern day originate from Him. We now are able to fight off germs, bacteria, viruses and the like because of His knowledge. Many researchers and medical doctors are stunned at the accuracy and effectiveness of its many provisions. The Wycliffe Bible Encyclopedia tells us that the laws given by God to Moses contain remarkable rules pertaining to public health which concerns us even today: water and food contamination, sewage disposal, infectious diseases, and health education.

The following is taken from the February, 2016 issue of Crossroads, a Newsletter of the Center for Spirituality, Theology & Health, Duke University. Many of you will find this research interesting.

In one of the first reports from the **Landmark Spirituality and Health Survey**, researchers at the University of Michigan analyzed cross-sectional data from a nationwide survey of 1,774 U.S. adults to identify associations between a benevolent view of God, gratitude to God, hope, and physical health. A benevolent image of God was determined by agreement to the three statements: "Despite my shortcomings, I feel forgiven by God"; "I believe God is merciful"; and "I believe God will forgive my shortcomings." Also assessed were frequency of attendance at religious services, spiritual support from one's congregation, gratitude to God, and hope.

**Results:** Persons who attended religious services more often and received more spiritual support from members of their congregation had a more benevolent image of God; those with a more benevolent image of God were more grateful to God; those who were more grateful to God experienced more hope; and greater hope was associated with better self-rated health and fewer physical symptoms. Researchers concluded that "...the foundational views that people have of God (i.e., their images of God) may have important health consequences."

It matters to our overall well-being what we think or believe about God. Knowing who God is, according to the Holy Bible, is critical to one's well-being. One powerful example is this. The Bible tells us that God's Son died on a cross so that we can be forgiven of our wrongdoings, and have a relationship with our Creator, God.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." John 3:16

If we believe and embrace this truth in our heart, it sets us up to spend eternal life in heaven, and favors well-being here on this earth.

Stay healthy and keep it cool in more ways than one.



May God bless you and Lakeside Christian Fellowship!


